## Intellectual Freedom



## **Purpose**

The Board has a fundamental responsibility for upholding the principles of, as well as advocating for, intellectual freedom. This policy ensures the rights of individuals to access information.

## Responsibility

West Perth Public Library Board adopts the Canadian Library Association's *Position Statement on Intellectual Freedom*, approved by the CLA Executive Council on June 27, 1974; amended November 17, 1983, November 18, 1985, November 17, 2015.

- 1. It is the responsibility of the West Perth Public Library Board and those who work in the Library to:
  - ensure that all Library users have the fundamental right to access to all expressions of knowledge, creativity and intellectual activity, and to express their thoughts publicly;
  - guarantee and facilitate access to all expressions of knowledge and intellectual activity, including those which some elements of society may consider to be unconventional, unpopular or unacceptable;
  - c. make available all of the Library's public facilities and service to all individuals and groups who need them;
  - d. resist all efforts to limit the exercise of these responsibilities, while recognizing the right of criticism by individuals and groups.
- The Board directs the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to ensure that the principles of intellectual freedom are integrated into all organizational policies, procedures and practices.
